To quote the post: “Yeahhyy! **Juan** and I are so proud! Our **Maria Eugenia**, promoted to **FULL PROFESOR (LA PROFE)**, at **UT Mexican American and Latino Studies Department**. Did we dream this, so many decades ago when as a preschooler she was at the endless planning sessions at **Dr. Paredes’** home and other safe spaces, birthplaces of the **Center for Mexican American Studies (CMAS)**?”

And later while she taught at the **University of Michigan**, we managed to establish the **Mexican American and Latino Studies Department**. We, the community made it happen...and now it's home to our brainy, brawny, impossibly, passionately committed scholar...

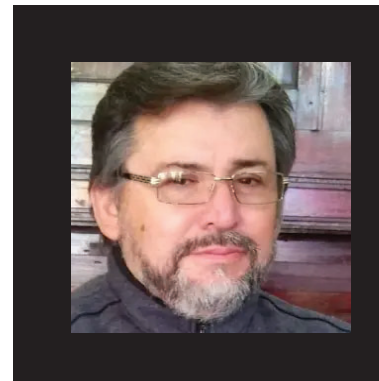
Sylvia Hurtado Voted AERA President-Elect

WASHINGTON, March 3, 2026—**Sylvia Hurtado, Distinguished Professor** in the **School of Educational and Information Studies** at the **University of California, Los Angeles**, has been voted president-elect of the **American Educational Research Association (AERA)**. **Hurtado** joins the **AERA Council** in 2026-2027 as president-elect, and her presidency begins at the conclusion of the association's **2027 Annual Meeting**.

Hurtado studies the transition to college, the campus racial climate, and STEM pathways and interventions. Her research centers equity for historically marginalized groups and institutional transformation and has been funded by the **Institute of Education Sciences**, the **National Institutes of Health**, and the **National Science Foundation**, as well as distinguished organizations such as the **Spencer Foundation**, the **Ford Foundation**, the **Howard Hughes Medical Institute**, and the **Gates Foundation**.

Engaged in **AERA** since graduate school. **Hurtado** was inducted as an **AERA Fellow** in 2011 and received the **2018 AERA Social Justice in Education Award**. She has served as co-editor for **AERA's** peer-review journal **Educational Evaluation and Policy Analysis** since 2023.

Growing up in a segregated town as a first-generation Latina college student led to roles as a certified teacher and change agent in college admissions. **Hurtado** graduated from **Princeton University** with an A.B. in Sociology. She received her M.Ed. from the **Harvard Graduate School of Education** and her Ph.D from in **Higher Education** from the **University of California at Los Angeles**.



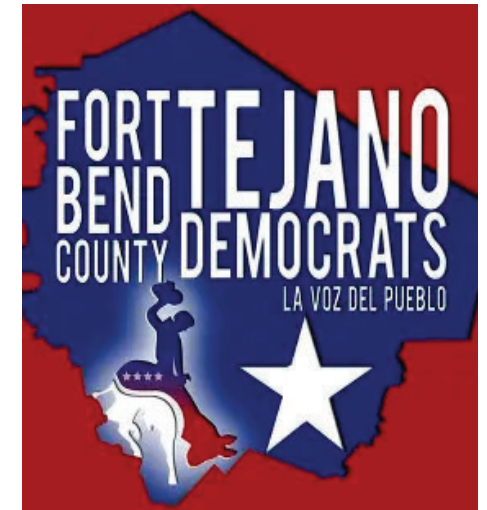
Louis Q. Reyes III Honored in Seguin as

The **Mexican American Student Association** at **Texas Lutheran University** was founded in 1971 to promote, celebrate, and showcase **Mexican-American** culture, history, and people.

This year the organization decided to venture outside its traditional scope and selected community activist **Louis Q. Reyes III** for the honor of “*Una Serie de los Poderosa.*”

Working closely with the **Center for Mexican-American Studies (CMAS)**, **MASA** provides a culturally safe space where **Mexican-American** students can learn, develop, and practice leadership skills and forge lifetime memories and friendships as they prepare for leadership roles.

Reyes is a staple of the greater **Seguin** community. He spent about 25 years in education, helping to guide **Seguin ISD** as a school board member and president. A graduate of **Seguin High School** and **San Antonio Community College**, where he majored in accounting, **Mr. Louis Q. Reyes III** was the first Hispanic president of the **Seguin ISD** board of trustees. He is a businessman and the owner of a local **All-state Insurance** group.

FALLEN ANGEL

The news of the abuse of women and children by **Cesar Chavez** came as a shock to many.. especially to those who had invested so much into the success of the **United Farm Workers Union**.

Faced with this horrific set of headlines and the painful details of these situations the **UFW** and **Chavez Foundation** pushed them to cancel the many National Celebrations of **Cesar's** birthday on March 31st.

Many like myself joined the union as young dreamers of justice and Freedom. In 1970 I began my journey as a full time organizer earning \$5 wages and \$10 for food weekly. Thousands of us sacrificed to get union contracts and to build a foundation of hope.

Joining the union I stopped selling drugs, and got rid of the two pistols I owned with which I planned to harm my enemies.

I learned that Love was stronger than Hate and that non violence was soon to be my road healing. In 1993 **Cesar** died and by 94 I was the Foun ng Director of the **Cesar E. Chavez Foundation**.

As a human rights activists I have seen many movements where the leadership had abused the power they managed To read that **Cesar** had abused **UFW** cofounder **Dolores Huerta** and abused children in the 70's was hard to read and digest.

Over the years I had on more than one occasion written that **Cesar** was neither a god nor a saint. I had challenged him and the union on several issues and was almost fired more than once.

I would hope that all who had been abused can feel safe enough to come forward. And we must meet them with love and respect and help them to heal. And perhaps find us a way for all of us to also heal.

Dolores struggled for decades as a strong woman leader in mostly male oriented movement with a heavy cloud of machismo.

Twenty some years ago she left the **UFW** and founded the **DOLORES HUERTA FOUNDATION** where she builds a new and exciting home for young people especially young girls and women to organize and flourish. At almost 96 she continues to be the face of freedom for so many



The **UFW** created a national movement that empowered farm workers and their supporters to take on large growers and their right wing friends and through a boycott of lettuce and grapes win union contracts for farmworkers.

So many activists like myself learned how to organize, challenge a racist system, fight for justice with out violence. And the sacrifices we all made were incredible. And many of us continue our fight for human rights for everyone.

Today already there are efforts to remove **Cesar's** name from buildings and schools. We know that this is difficult for the movement but also for the **Chavez** family and especially for the victims who have come forward. And we should not be surprised it there are even more victims.

Moving into the future we must ensure that the rights of young girls and women are protected and that we respond appropriately to the victims and their families

The enemies of the union, **Chavez**, farmworkers and **Mexican Americans** will call for a public lynching and the total destruction of the fabric of a movement that over the years has done so much good work.



WHAT IS HAPPENING AT ST. EDWARDS UNIVERSITY

St. Edward's University has experienced a long-term downward trend in student enrollment, with the population decreasing by 1,587 students over the last decade to 3,033 in the 2024–2025 academic year. While specific 2025–2026 figures are not yet finalized, the university continues to navigate broader national enrollment challenges. Despite these trends, the university maintains a competitive profile, ranking 5th among Best Regional Universities in the West for 2026.

Enrollment Context

Historical Decline: Over the past 10 years, undergraduate enrollment fell by 1,524 students, while graduate enrollment decreased by 63.

Current Demographics: As of 2024–2025, the student body consists of 2,499 undergraduates and 534 graduate students. The student population is 82.39% undergraduate.

Shift in Delivery: While total enrollment has trended downward, the university has seen a significant increase—862.07%—in exclusively online enrollment since 2015.

Market Factors: Like many institutions, **St. Edward's** is subject to the “enrollment cliff,” driven by declining birth rates in the early 2000s that have reduced the pool of traditional college-aged students.

About St. Edwards University

St. Edward's University is a private, Catholic university in **Austin, Texas**, United States. It was founded and is operated in the **Holy Cross** tradition.

History

St. Edward's University was founded by **Edward Sorin, Superior General** of the **Congregation of Holy Cross**, who also founded the **University of Notre Dame** in **Notre Dame, Indiana**. **Sorin** established the institution on farmland south of **Austin** in 1877 and named it **St. Edward's Academy** in honor of his patron saint, **King Edward the Confessor**. The high school section later separated to become **St. Edward's High School** but closed during the 1970s. It is affiliated with the **Congregation of Holy Cross**.

In 1885, president **P.J. Franciscus** secured a charter and changed the name to **St. Edward's College**. Under the presidency of **Peter Joseph Hurth** (1886–1894), enrollment increased. The first school newspaper (1888), the organization of baseball and football teams, and approval to start building an administration building (1889) all followed. Architect **Nicholas J. Clayton** of **Galveston, Texas** was commissioned to design the college's Main Building. The structure was built four stories tall in the **Gothic Revival** style and was constructed with local white limestone.

Twentieth century

In 1903, a fire destroyed the majority of Main Building, but it was rebuilt by the fall. In 1922, Main Building sustained damage from a tornado that caused significant damage all



over the campus. Main Building was added to the **National Register of Historic Places** in 1973. In 1925, **St. Edward's** received its university charter. Most of the personnel at the time were **Holy Cross** priests and brothers. Women arrived at **St. Edward's** in 1966 as students for **Maryhill College**, a coordinate institution. By 1970, **Maryhill** was absorbed and **St. Edward's** became co-educational.

By 1971, the university granted bachelor's and master's degrees in business administration. Also added were the **College Assistance Migrant Program**, or **CAMP** (1972); a professionally oriented Theater Arts curriculum (1972); a degree program for adults called **New College** (1974); and **Freshman Studies** (1975). In 1984, **Patricia Hayes** became the second layperson to lead **St. Edward's University**. In 1990, enrollment reached 3,000 for the first time. This decade also ushered in civic initiatives and capital improvements.

St. Edward's endowment, as of 2015, stood at more than \$92.4 million.

2026 **U.S. News Regional Universities** (West) ranking **St. Edward's University** ranked 5th for the second consecutive year in the 2026 **U.S. News & World Report** ranking of the **Best Regional Universities** in the West. In the same report, the university was ranked 2nd in Undergraduate Teaching, 3rd in Best Value Schools, and 4th in Best Colleges for Veterans.

Expansion (1999–present)

George E. Martin served as the institution's 23rd president. From Fall 1999–Summer 2021, **Martin** oversaw a period of expansion for **St. Edward's** that included transforming the campus through the construction of many new buildings, doubling enrollment, growing the endowment, building global partnerships and founding the **Holy Cross Institute** to sustain the mission of the **Brothers of the Congregation of Holy Cross**. In February 2022, **Montserrat Fuentes** was inaugurated as the 24th president and first Hispanic president of **St. Edward's University**. As part of her presidential inaugural address, **Fuentes** unveiled the university's Strategic Plan 2027.

U.T. Consolidation does not maintain public trust or fulfill the university's mission for the majority of Texans

In South Texas public schools, I learned about **Robert E. Lee** and **George Washington**, and the histories of the **United States** and **Texas**. Yet not a single lesson addressed **Mexican American** history – our **Indigenous** and **African** roots, or the men and women who shaped this country. It was as if only **Anglos** made history.

It was only when I took an ethnic studies course in college that I discovered **Mexican Americans** have a history— one deeply intertwined with that of other communities.

Later, when a career move took me to **New England**, did that education prove invaluable. It was that knowledge which shaped my professional life and prepared me to work with diverse communities.

I share this experience because the University of Texas now risks denying today's students the same opportunity.

I share this experience because the **University of Texas** now risks denying today's students the same opportunity. **UT President Jim Davis** recently announced a proposal that will effectively end the advancement of **Mexican American Studies** and related fields of study at the university. The proposal consolidates the **Department of Mexican American and Latina/o Studies (MALS)**, the **Department of African and African Diaspora Studies**, the **Department of American Studies**, and the **Department of Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies** into a single department called the **Department of Social and Cultural Analysis**.

In practical terms, the restructuring will result in funding cuts for staffing and research as well as elimination of programs, threatening decades of academic achieve-

ment that made **UT** a leading center for the study of **Mexican Americans** and **Latino** communities. **Davis** has framed the restructuring as necessary to maintain public trust and fulfill the universities mission.

For **Latino** and **African American** communities, the consolidation has the opposite effect. It neither builds trust nor fulfills the university's responsibility to serve a state where communities of color are the majority. Among departments most affected are **MALS** and its affiliates, including the **Latino Research Institute (LRI)** and the **Center for Mexican American Studies (CMAS)**.

CMAS was established more than 50 years ago in response to student and community . . .

CMAS, established more than 50 years ago in response to student and community advocacy, plays a crucial role in advancing research and public understanding of **Mexican American** and **Latino** histories, cultures, and contributions.

MALS, founded 15 years ago, has a national reputation as a preeminent center for the research and teaching that brings distinction to the university. These programs are not redundant or fragmented. They are the result of decades of scholarship, community engagement, and institutional development.

Equally troubling is the lack of meaningful consultation with those most affected by this proposal. **President Davis** has disregarded public input from major stakeholder communities. Two months ago, the **Latino Coalition for Excellence in Higher Education**—a consortium that includes the **League of**

United Latin American Citizens (LU-LAC), **Hispanic Advocates and Business Leaders of Austin (HABLA)**, the **Latino Texas Policy Center (LTPC)**, and the **Texas Association of Mexican American Chambers of Commerce (TAMACC)**—formally requested dialogue. Similarly, the **Texas Exes Hispanic Alumni Network**, the university's official **Latino** alumni organization, sent a letter in November 2025.

Both groups expressed a willingness to collaborate with university leadership to ensure the continued vitality of **Latino Studies**. To date, these communications have been ignored, signaling a troubling lack of engagement with communities that have long supported and invested in **UT**.

This consolidation appears to be politically motivated, aligning with state and national efforts to restrict diversity, equity, and in-

clusion. **Texas Governor Greg Abbott**, **Lt. Governor Dan Patrick** along with **President Donald Trump** have all advocated eliminating what they label “divisive” academic programs. These efforts disproportionately target the study of Mexican Americans, Latinos, and other minority communities.

Consolidating or diluting departments centered on communities of color – while leaving other academic fields intact – sends a message about whose histories are valued. More than 11 million Texans identify as **Latino**, representing about 40% of the state's population and 53% of students in **Texas** public schools. To marginalize the academic study of these communities amounts to institutional racism. “*Education without representation*” is wrong and must be challenged.

Davis' announcement raises serious questions about process, transparency, and accountability.

Who conducted the review cited in his memo? What evidence supports claims of “fragmentation” and “inconsistency”?

Why have affected faculty, students, alumni, and community organizations been excluded from meaningful participation?

Where is the report that upports President Davis' recommendations?

The proposed consolidation threatens not only specific departments, but the university's commitment to academic excellence and public service. Community organizations, alumni, and advocates urge university leadership to halt the consolidation, engage with stakeholders, and uphold the integrity of programs that reflect and serve all the people of **Texas**. Only through open dialogue and accountability can the university maintain public trust and fulfill its mission to all Texans.

Recordando a Los Campesinos

Las Lagrimas de Maria

Fifty years ago, I was fresh out of UC Berkeley and working as a labor organizer for Cesar Chavez in Watsonville, California. I can still recall vividly an older farm worker named Maria. She was maybe 62 or 63 years of age. She would make it a point to stop by the field office at least once a week to give us "her report" of what was going on when she was working in the strawberries.

One time she came in with tears flowing down her cheeks. "¿Que te pasa Maria?" one of the organizers in the office asked her. I went to get her a glass of water. When I returned, she was telling Carlos Ruiz that all day she had been harassed by a new foreman where she had been working. He had "caught her talking" and told her to forget about the idea of a union. Forget Cesar Chavez helping her and forget about wearing that little UFW button that he had seen inside her jacket when he sneaked his own little peek. Each time she went out to dump her trays of strawberries he would tell her something. She said that by the end of the day she couldn't take it anymore and in front of several men and women she said, "Just wait cabron, porque cuando llega Cesar Chavez y su gente, a ti se te va llevar la chingada!" (You just wait son of a bitch, when Cesar Chavez and his people arrive, you are going to be in for a hell of a time.) (polite translation)



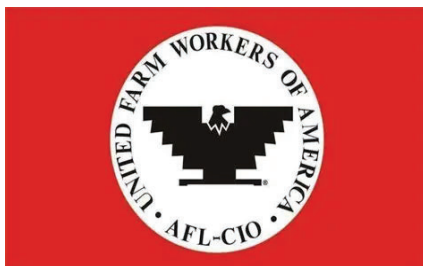
She said that not only did she shock herself with that outburst but that the others who were standing around almost fell to the ground in utter disbelief that an old woman like her could crank it up like that. Maria said the foreman was also taken aback and didn't know what to say so he just turned around and walked away.

After another drink of water Carlos asked her, "Pues, Maria, si usted le dijo eso al mayordomo, por qué esta llorando ahorita?" (Well Maria, if you told that to the foreman, why are you crying now?) She put the glass of water down and looked Carlos straight in the eyes and said, "Porque mañana voy a sacar mi botón y lo voy poner en frente para que todos pueden ver con quién ando. Estas lagrimas son lagrimas de gusto porque yo ya no voy andar de rodillas." (Because tomorrow I am going to take my button out and put it on in front so everyone can see who I'm with. These tears you see are tears of joy because I am no longer going to be on my knees.)

Despite her age and the need to work, Maria was always willing to participate in union activities and take off from work. On more than one occasion she would take off from work and go with us to meetings. She went with us to Modesto and she joined us for at least 3 of the five Mondays in May of 1975 when we went to Sacramento to lobby for the ALRA law. (This was the new law that allowed farm workers to vote on the question of unionization.)

Maria was a Chavista to the max! Those tears that Maria brought into the office that day always served to remind Carlos and I that the five dollars a week we were paid by the union was far too much compensation for what we were learning about the spirit of people who believed that one day their time to stand up would come.

When Carlos and I were out and about in town or in the labor camps, we always made it a point to look for the faces with the tears, because if we could find the tears, we would find another Maria. And that is how we built the United Farm workers Union of America - AFL-CIO.

□□□ THE FORGOTTEN WOMAN WHO
FOUGHT FOR FARM WORKERS

Long before the farmworker movement became famous, there was a courageous woman whose voice helped change history.

Her name was Maria Moreno.

Born in Texas in 1920, Maria grew up in a migrant farmworker family and later worked in the fields of California. Life for farmworkers in those years was incredibly difficult. Families often lived in crowded migrant camps, wages were low, and many workers had little protection under labor laws.

Maria was also a mother of 12 children, and like many farmworker families, they struggled just to get enough food.

In 1958, devastating floods in Tulare County, California left hundreds of farmworkers without jobs. Because of the rules at the time, farmworkers were not eligible for food assistance.

Families were going hungry.

Maria Moreno decided to speak out.

She publicly testified about the hardship farmworkers were facing, describing how migrant families—including her own—were struggling to survive. Her courage drew public attention, and soon local officials reversed their decision and began providing food aid to farmworkers.

Her leadership did not stop there.

In 1959, Maria became one of the first organizers hired by the Agricultural Workers Organizing Committee, helping farmworkers organize and demand fair treatment.

This happened before the famous farmworker movement led by

César Chávez and Dolores Huerta.

Maria helped unite workers from many backgrounds—Mexican-American, Filipino, Black, and white migrant laborers—showing that the struggle for dignity and fair wages crossed all communities.

For many years, her story was almost forgotten. But today historians recognize Maria Moreno as one of the early pioneers of the farmworker labor movement in the United States.

Her courage reminds us that history is often shaped not only by famous leaders, but also by ordinary people who refuse to stay silent when others are suffering.

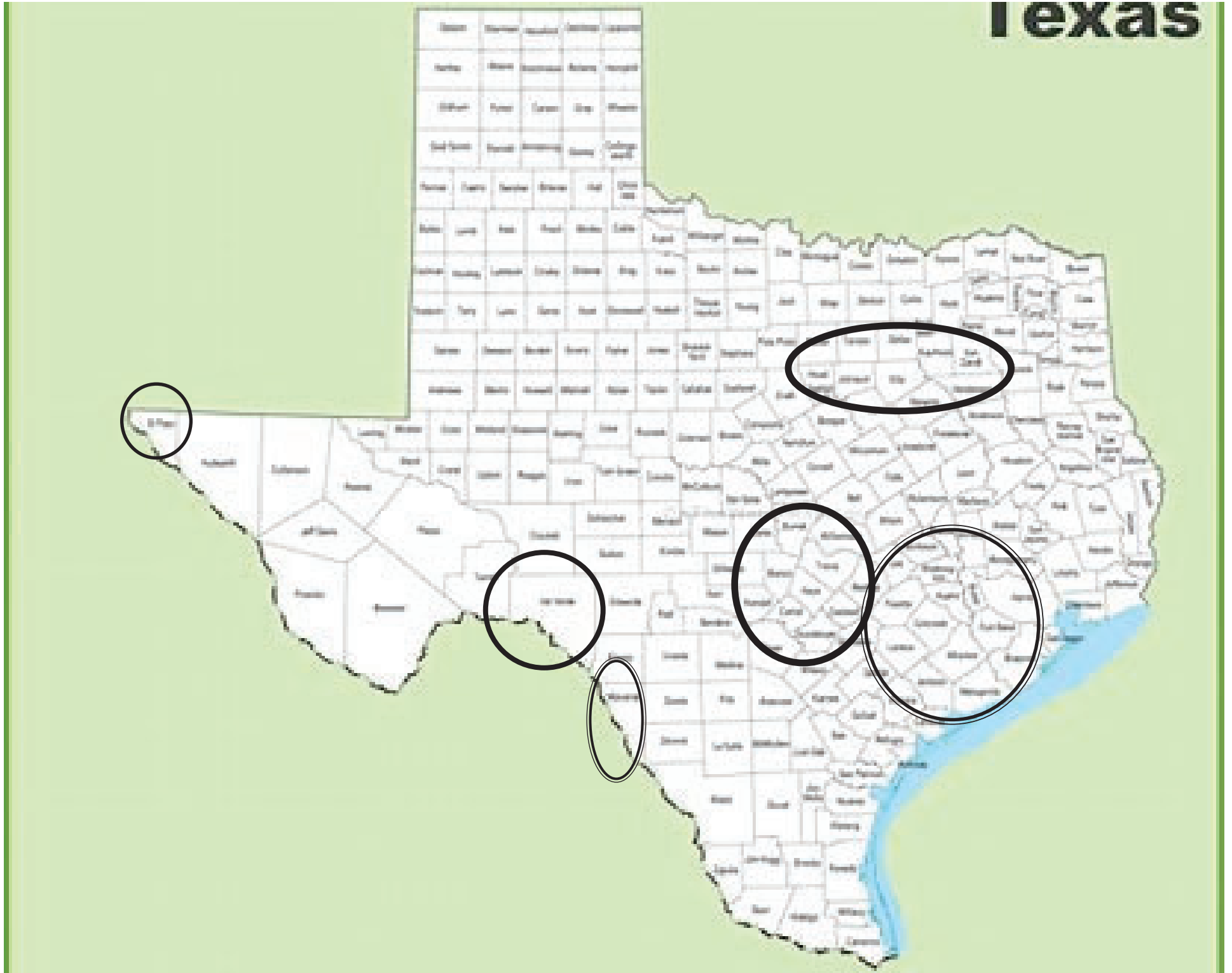

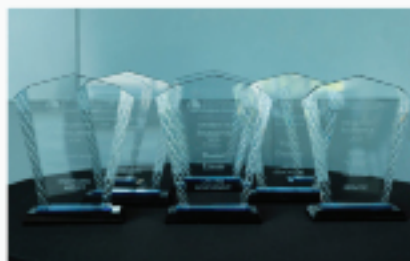

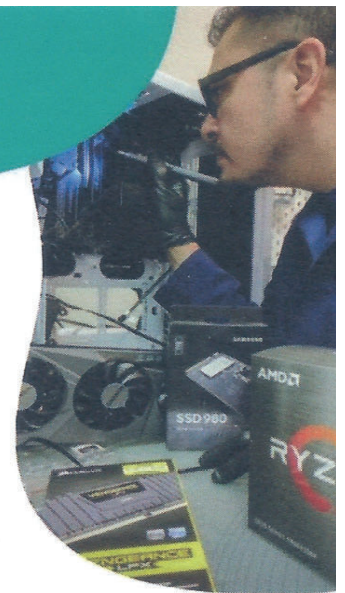
